Arima Court

2006 Named in honor of basketball coach Yoshito "Tom" Arima who lead the Varsity basketball team to 14 Northern League Championships. (1960-1980)

1970 Original entrance leading to the Campanile building. This is now the side entrance to the school auditorium foyer.

Erdmann Stadium

2011 Named in honor of Business teacher, & athletic advocate Dentler Erdmann. 1975 California Teacher of the Year



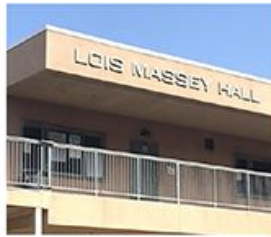
Joseph Young Mosaic

1972 The artist (1919-2007) was known for his public artwork in mosaic murals, stain glass windows and granite sculptures. Located on the exterior wall, right side side of the cafeteria, main building



Ceiling Light

The light fixture is from the Campanile building. Located outside at the Loma Drive entrance to the West Wing building



Lois Massey Hall

2005 Named in honor of Physical Education teacher and coach Lois Massey. West side of Loma Drive



Modern Youth

The statue was a gift to the school from the Winter Class of 1937. The student model was Jerome Reynolds W'38. It was sculpted by artist Jason "Jessie" Herron. Main building, first floor near the center main entrance

Montgomery Field

The scoreboard was named in honor of G. Millage Montgomery, the first Boy's Vice Principal of the Belmont (1923-31) in recognition of his dedicated organization of the new school.

The Rotunda

1970 Constructed with "Belmont red brick" from the original Campanile tower building. The time capsule floor plates were relocated here from Loma Drive.



The Sentinel

The statue was a gift to the school from the Class of 1992. Modeled after Dentler Erdmann. Student cafeteria, located on the Flats



The Trees on Loma Drive



The 100 year old trees were planted when the school was built and opened in 1923. Next to the West Wing



The Tritt Bronze Tablet

William Winters Tritt (1873-1930) served as the first principal of Belmont. Dedicated in 1931, the tablet acknowledges his kindly council and uplifting influence. Main office, west end 2nd floor, main building

1926 Trophy

The first cup that went into Belmont's trophy case was won by the Cross Country championship team. Main building 2nd floor near the library, multiple trophy cases along the hallway
